The SWMJCC and the CRICKET CLUB have adopted the following Codes of Behaviour for Junior Cricket which have been drafted by Cricket Australia (formally the ACB) and the Australian Sports Commission.

PLAYER'S CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

- Play by the rules.
- Never argue with an umpire. If you disagree, have your captain, coach or manager approach the umpire during a break or after the game.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials & sledging other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in cricket.
- Work equally hard for yourself and your team mates. Your team's performance will benefit and so will you.
- Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether they are made by your team or the opposition.
- Treat all participants in cricket as you like to be treated. Do not bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor.
- Cooperate with your coach, team mates and opponents. Without them there would be no competition.
- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please parents and coaches.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

PARENT'S / GUARDIAN'S CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

- Do not force an unwilling child to participate in cricket.
- Remember, children are involved in cricket for their enjoyment, not yours.
- Encourage your child to play by the rules.
- Focus on the child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing. Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a game.
- Remember that children learn best by example. Appreciate good performances and skilful plays by all participants.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- Show appreciation for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, your child could not participate.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

RULES & CONDITIONS

1. **DRESS STANDARDS:** Sun Smart Policy of long-sleeved shirt and long trousers are recommended. Hats are obligatory – wide brimmed hats are recommended.
2. **PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT:** Batsmen **MUST** wear helmets with grills when facing all bowlers. Wicket keepers must wear pads and gloves. Wicket keepers **MUST** wear mouthguards. Helmets with grills are **COMPULSORY** when keeping up to the stumps. All batsmen and wicket keepers must wear protectors (boxes).
